# Being United Methodist

I have beside me on my desk, the 2016 Book of Discipline of The UMC. I wish you could see it. It is filled with sticky notes (which I love), paperclipped pages, and lots of highlights. It looks like a well-loved book, though "loved" is not what I would say about it. Maybe, instead, a well-used and referenced book. I once had a church member say that they had read the entire Book of Discipline and knew what it said. I applauded them. But even after all these years and the many notes and highlights, and though I have read most of it, I am still learning the importance of The Book of Discipline.

Like many clergy, I have a love/hate relationship with The Book of Discipline. I love it because it articulates our Doctrinal Standards and General Rules and because it outlines the ordering of the Local Church, Conference, Jurisdiction, and General Conference. I have served and do serve on committees, and the Book of Discipline helps guide the work of these committees. Hence, the many sticky notes. I am sure you agree that it is important for a denomination to have a book such as The Book of Discipline because it outlines what we believe and how we live out our faith as United Methodists.

Over the past ten days, our denomination has been meeting in Charlotte, North Carolina, for the 2024 General Conference. The General Conference is the voting body for our denomination. It is a time when the Church looks at The Book of Discipline and votes on legislation that has been submitted. The North Georgia Conference has been updating its website, and United Methodist news sources have given daily reports on the events. There has been a lot of legislation that has come before the General Conference for a vote. I am sure that you are like me and have questions about the legislation that has been passed by the General Conference. I plan to assess and then communicate with you the results of the General Conference and its approved legislation in the next few weeks. Every four years for decades we have held a General Conference, so regardless of the legislation, we will continue to be the great church that we are as we live into our vision of being a welcoming church growing in Christian faith and serving in love.

Join us as we celebrate our incredible 2024 High School Graduates. We will also continue our series, little book, BIG IDEAS on 1 John, as we talk about the importance of faith. It is a great day to be in church!
