

## Celebrating the Church

Today is Pentecost, the day when the Holy Spirit came upon the people of God and formed the church. The power of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost is symbolized by the color red. We encourage you to wear red as we celebrate the birth of the church.

Today we will also be commissioning the Coventry Ensemble (6th - 12th grade musicians) at the 11:15 a.m. service, as they prepare to depart on their 57th annual tour. Our students will provide music, hope, and food in concert, worship, and service. On our tour, we will stay in one big house, cook our own meals, and experience meaningful togetherness.

But why do any of this?

Just as choral singing develops personal and social courage in a way that other "performed" activities do not, so too does traveling in a group teach lifelong skills in a unique way: teamwork, humility, resourcefulness, emotional balance, and communication. Older students on their fifth or sixth tour help younger students find out how much they matter and belong. Ultimately, we cannot know exactly what every experience will bring missionally, musically, and spiritually. We hope that those unforeseeable benefits help us to be more present when we return home. Maybe we will see the people around us in new ways, appreciate their love in different ways, and show our love in new, needed ways.

As a Coventry Ensemble, we sometimes pray together the 'New Beatitudes for a Hurting World' by Lutheran pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber:

"Blessed are they who doubt.

Blessed are those who have nothing to offer.

Blessed are they who have buried their loved ones, for whom tears could fill an ocean.

Blessed are they who have loved enough to know what loss feels like.

Blessed are they who don't have the luxury of taking things for granted anymore.

Blessed are they who can't fall apart,

because they have to keep it together for everyone else.

Blessed are those who mourn.

Blessed are those who no one else notices,

the kids who sit alone at middle school lunch tables,

the laundry guys at the hospital,

and the night-shift street sweepers.

Blessed are the forgotten,

blessed are the closeted,

blessed are the unemployed,

the unimpressive,

the underrepresented.

Blessed are the wrongly accused, the ones who never catch a break, the ones for whom life is hard, for Jesus chose to surround himself with people like them."

May we all live into this prayer and may our tour glorify God honoring the vision to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Thank you for supporting another enriching choir tour.
